Aviation event will let young Detroiters soar above city

There will be plenty of earthbound displays, but the Detroit Fly-In will send drones, planes, and young folks up above it all. Anybody interested in what Detroit's aerospace high school has to offer has an excellent opportunity next month, with the Inaugural Detroit Fly-In, a daylong event taking place May 15.



You might never have known that Detroit Public Schools has a high school devoted to aviation, where students for careers as pilots, mechanics, and air traffic controllers. It's called Davis Aerospace Technical High School. It has a 100 percent graduation rate, higher than that of Cass Tech, and has a pedigree stretching back to the Second World War.

The school was founded in 1943, back when Detroit was the Arsenal of Democracy. Both adults and students studied there then, learning how to repair the warbirds Detroit was turning out. When the war ended, the school was retained as a high school for training aeromechanics, and it was later renamed for Gen. Benjamin O. Davis Jr., the first African-American four-star general in the U.S. Air Force.

The school used to have open houses every year, but since emergency manager-run DPS, in its infinite wisdom, moved the school off airport grounds to Golightly Career and Technical Center. (Now, when the students want hands-on training, they have to be transported more than three miles.)

But activities at the city airport continue for Davis' students. Every other Sunday, Detroiters between the ages of 8 and 17 get to go up in the air with volunteer general aviation pilots in Cessnas, Pipers, and gliders, so the aspiring fliers can gain an opportunity to try out their co-pilot skills.

Next month's event will have all that and more, although, on that busy day, families hoping to get their young ones in the air should arrive as early as possible. Tuskegee Airmen will be in attendance, and there will be military aircraft, choppers, and demonstrations of drone aircraft as well. We hear from the executive director of Friends of Detroit City Airport, Beverly Kindle-Walker, that there's even a chance Michelle Obama's baby-blue 737 could touch down to join the affair.

Bringing the lessons of the Tuskegee Airmen to 178 classrooms for Black History Month By Bill Shepard

As leader of the CAF Red Tail Squadron, it's a privilege to talk to people – especially kids – about the Tuskegee Airmen. And if they don't know that part of our history, our mission is that much more critical! For all those we can't reach face-to-face at events, we have a resource kit for classroom use that gives teachers and youth leaders the tools they need to introduce this important and inspirational piece of history to their students.



The kit focuses on the principles that are based on the lessons of the Tuskegee Airmen - Aim High, Believe In Yourself, Use Your Brain, Be Ready To Go, Never Quit, Expect to Win. Our hope is that these materials will help bring the lessons of the Tuskegee Airmen out of the history books straight into the everyday lives of students. The kit includes posters, DVD, pocket-sized books, inspirational dog tags, children's book and classroom activities.

We kicked-off a fundraising campaign in September 2015 with a goal to get these kits into the hands of as many teachers as possible *for free* in time for Black History Month. We were pleased that enough supporters stepped up that we were able to provide 178 kits in over 39 states to schools in high-minority enrollment districts!

The kits were delivered by the beginning of February so teachers could utilize the information in their lesson plans for Black History Month. Students also had the opportunity to participate in a contest to put into action what they learned about the importance of education and determination, based on the Tuskegee Airmen's example of overcoming adversity.

We're privileged to be able to travel around the country to ensure the legacy of the Tuskegee Airmen is not forgotten. Beyond the events, it's crucial to include in our efforts all those who aren't able to come see us in person. Every classroom in America should teach the lessons of the Tuskegee Airmen! We hope to continue this important outreach work and donate even more kits to teachers in honor of next year's Black History Month.

I think you understand when I say this labor of love is not work...it's a lifestyle! It's like it's a part our DNA; we're just wired this way. And I'm proud to say that because of this, our collective efforts are not only honoring the Tuskegee Airmen, but also helping inspire kids to be their very best!



Tuskegee Airman, 94, awarded Bronze Star at **Detroit NAACP dinner**

DETROIT (AP) — A 94-yearold Detroit native has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for heroic service and meritorious achievement during World War II. Lt. Col. Alexander Jefferson was presented the award by U.S. Sen. Debbie Stabenow on Sunday at the 61st Annual Detroit NAACP Freedom



Fund Dinner. Stabenow says Jefferson is one of the few remaining Tuskegee Airmen still alive. It was the first African-American unit to fly combat airplanes in World War II. In 1944, he was shot down on his 19th mission in Europe and taken prisoner by the Nazis. His prison camp was liberated in 1945, but he saw atrocities at the Dachau concentration camp. In 2007, Jefferson and other Tuskegee Airmen received the Congressional Gold Medal — the nation's highest civilian honor.

Why I Fly Young Eagles

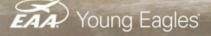
"My neighbor, Robert Shurney, a NASA engineer, got a friend of his to take me flying in his Cessna 172 when I was 12 years old. After that flight I spent many hours building airplanes and rockets. I eventually earned a Ph.D. in biomedical engineering, and later in life I dedicated myself to educating other underrepresented youth to careers in aviation.

"I started EAA Chapter 1351 around the turn of the century with the sole purpose of doing Young Eagles rallies. Several of the Young Eagles I flew went on to pursue careers in aviation, and several are in the Tuskegee Airmen Flight Academy, an aviation program run by the Tuskegee Airmen National Museum, where a dedicated student can earn a pilot certificate."

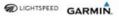














Judge Harold Wood, a Westchester trailblazer, dies

Wood, the first black State Supreme Court justice in the county, was a formative part of black history in Westchester.

Harold L. Wood, a Westchester trailblazer who became the first African-American member of the County Board of Supervisors and later the first African-American state Supreme Court justice in the county, died last Thursday in Florida at the age of 96.

Remembered by his family as humane, thoughtful and often hilarious, Wood served as an anchor to his children, his daughter, LaVerne Jill Wood, said.

"When he was just 4 years old he would help direct his father out the driveway, and he really has been the di-

rector — the guiding light — of our family ever since," she said.

OBITUARY NOTICE: Harold L. Wood

Born in Ossining during the heart of America's Jim Crow racial segregation era, Wood forged a path largely unique to African-Americans in Westchester and throughout the country. During World War II, he served in the Army Air Corps on the Tuskegee Airbase in Alabama, where he grew close with many of the members of the historic Tuskegee Airmen African-American aviation unit who trained in Tuskegee.

After the war, Wood attended Lincoln University in Pennsylvania and received a law degree from Cornell University and a master of laws from New York University Law School. A series of firsts soon followed: the Westchester County Board of Supervisors — predecessor of the current county Board of Legislators — the Mount Vernon City Council, Westchester Family Court judge, County Court judge, and 9th District state Supreme Court justice. His election to the Board of Supervisors in 1957 had made him the first African-American elected to public office in Westchester. He retired from the Supreme Court in 1995.

Throughout his storied career, Wood, a Republican, earned the respect and admiration of his colleagues. Over 600 people turned out for his retirement dinner, and state Supreme Court Justice Orazio Bellantoni referred to Wood as his mentor at Wood's funeral on Tuesday, Wood's daughter said.

"I knew his accomplishments, but I just remember him as dad," she added. "He gave tremendous advice, he always told me 'take the high road,' no matter how complex or aggressive things got."

However impressive Wood's career was, LaVerne Jill Wood kept coming back to her father's irrepressible humor and curiosity.

She spoke of his heartfelt desire never to face his wife, Thelma, in double's tennis. "If she was on the other team she would never quite let him get to the baseline before she would hit him in the backside," she recalled, laughing. Thelma Wood died in 2007.

In addition to his daughter, Wood, who lived in Somers before moving to Florida, is survived by his sons, Gregory Lance Wood and Dean Christopher Wood; three grandchildren, Natasha, Michael, and Lauren; and numerous nieces and nephews.

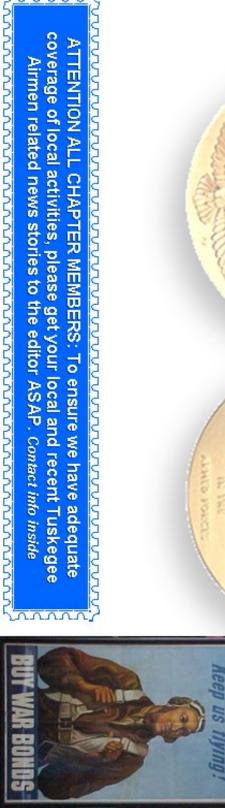
